What is Course Registration?

Students meet one on one with their school counselors to select courses for the upcoming school year

For grades 9-11

Students come to the Guidance Office during a scheduled period of their Social Studies class

Middle School Course Selection

- Students will receive a pass with an appointment time to meet with their counselor
- Appointments are approx. 10 minutes
- The Guide should be completed before the appointment to make scheduling run smoothly
- Choose 4 back up electives and two languages

Graduation Requirements

- ★ 4 years of English
- ★ 4 years of PE
- ★ 3 years of Social Studies (WC, US 1, & US 2)
- ★ 3 years of Math (Alg 1, Geom, & Alg 2 or higher)
- ★ 3 years of Science (Bio & 2 others)
- ★ 1 year of a World Language
- ★ 1 Practical Art
- ★ 1 Fine/Performing Art
- ★ 1 Financial Literacy (2.5 credits or more)

- ★ 120 total credits

Students who take at least 3 courses in a particular pathway will be awarded a concentration in that subject area and it will be noted on the student transcript.

Dual Credit

Dual credit courses are offered at the high school and are taught by EHTHS faculty members. Students who enroll in dual credit courses may be eligible to receive high school credits, along with college credits, provided all articulation criteria are met.

Articulation agreements are determined by the college/university and specific course offerings may vary from year to year.

Dual credit courses through Stockton and Atlantic Cape are transferable to many other 2-yr & 4-yr institutions. Please check individual institution policies for full details.

Pay a fee of \$54.50 per ACCC credit to the college to receive college credit.

Receive a grade of 70 or higher in the dual credit course

Note: A timeline with application deadlines will be distributed in the dual credit class and must be met in order to receive credit from the college

Pay a fee of \$100 per credit to the college

Receive a grade of 70 or higher in the dual credit course

Teacher Recommendations

- January 2019
 - Can be altered until May 1st
- If students want a certain level or class, they need to speak to their teachers directly to advocate for themselves
- Counselors will not schedule classes without the appropriate recommendations
 - Ex: A student wants to take HN Physics but does not have the teacher recommendation
- Recommendations are based on grades and preparedness for the next level
 - Review your current grades
 - Be sure to look at specific assignments, not just the overall grade
 - Do you have low test scores but a high homework average?

Sophomores February 19-March 1

Juniors March 4-14

Fernwood March 18-19*

Alder March 20-21*

*Course Registration for 8th grade students is different than High School

Drop/Add Periods

Students need to make an appointment with their counselor if they want to make ANY changes during these times:

March 25-28

April 29-May 2

August 26-29*

*Summer Drop/Add is on a space available basis only

Schedule Changes

Once school starts, new classes cannot be added to the schedule. The only changes that can be made are to levels of courses or dropping to a study hall

- No schedule changes until after the first full week of school
 - Unless there is an error
- Move up a level by the last school day in September
- AP level drop by October 1
- Drop a level (other than AP) by the last school day in October
- Drop a class for a study hall by the last school day in October
