COMMUNITY

• Egg Harbor Township is a large, suburban community located in Atlantic County, NJ, just west of Atlantic City. Over the last 15 years, the township has transformed from a rural area to an ethnically and economically diverse community. It is served by major highways including the Garden State Parkway and the Atlantic City Expressway.

SCHOOL

• Egg Harbor Township High School opened its doors for the first time during the 1983-1984 school year. EHTHS is a four-year comprehensive public high school, including grades 9-12. Current school population is approximately 2300 students with a senior class of approx. 570 students. Our faculty includes approximately 210 members, many holding advanced degrees.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

• Students at EHTHS are required to earn a minimum of 120 credits in order to receive a diploma. Those requirements include 4 years of English, 3 years of Science, 3 years of Mathematics, 2 years of United States History, 1 year of World Cultures, 1 year of World Language, 1 year of Fine/Performing Art, 1 year of Career/Tech Ed, ½ year of Financial Literacy and 1 year of Physical Education/Health for each year of attendance at EHTHS.

CURRICULUM FEATURES

• EHTHS has a four-day rotating schedule. Students are scheduled for 8 courses, six of which meet in a given day for

55-minute blocks. Our curriculum is designed to meet the unique and individual needs of all students as they pursue both college and career goals.

- EHTHS offers four selective academy programs: Medical Science Academy, Academy of Law/Business, Communications Academy and Culinary Arts Academy. Students have unique opportunities to pursue rigorous, specialized coursework and are exposed to related careers during a *senior experience* internship. Senior students also have access to certified Pre-Apprenticeship programs in medical assisting, manufacturing, aviation and HVAC.
- Students wishing to pursue coursework not currently offered by the school's curriculum may do so through Independent Study. The high school also has dual credit agreements with both Stockton University and Atlantic Cape Community College.
- EHT TV is a fully functional television station operated by students in the Media and Journalism programs. A brand-new Esports Arena and Innovation Lab opened in Sept 2024. Students have access to the latest technology in gaming, STEM, robotics and more.
- The Seal of Biliteracy certifies that a student has demonstrated the ability to read, write, speak and understand in both English and a second language. Students in their 4th year of study who meet the required proficiency earn the seal and it is noted on the transcript.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT/HONORS PROGRAM

• EHTHS offers AP courses in: English Language/Literature, Spanish Language/Literature, French, German, Latin, US History, Government, Art History, Psychology, European

History, African American Studies, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics (I, II, C), Environmental Science, Statistics, Computer Science, Computer Science Principles and Studio Art

• EHTHS offers Honors courses in: English (I, II, III, IV), Spanish (II, III, IV), French (II, III, IV), German (II, III), Latin (II, III), Hispanohablantes (II, III), World Cultures, US History I & II, Psychology, Biology, Chemistry, Physics I/II, Anatomy, Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-Calculus, Calculus, Philosophy, African American Studies, Computer Science, Education & Training III, ALAB/MSA courses

COURSE WEIGHTING/CLASS RANK

• Grade Point Average is computed at the end of each academic year in the month of July. It is determined by calculating a cumulative, numerical GPA carried out to the thousandths place (i.e. 94.158). All course grades, including physical education, are used in the calculation of cumulative GPA. Advanced Placement (AP) final course grades are given an additional weight of 20% in cumulative GPA calculations. Honors courses (HN) are given an additional weight of 10%. The additional weighting of these courses is for cumulative GPA purposes only. The grade a student receives on his/her report card/transcript is the actual grade earned in the class.

• EHTHS also calculates a 4.0 scale cumulative GPA for colleges and other institutions who request it. The official numerical scale, however, will always determine class rank. On the 4.0 scale, letter grades are assigned the following values:

POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION

• The Class of 2024 was approximately 561 in number with 79% pursuing further education. 55% plan to attend four-year colleges, 24% plan to attend two-year colleges, and 6% plan to attend other post-secondary technical/career institutions. The remaining students plan to enter the Armed Services (4%) or the workforce (11%). This year's graduates were awarded over \$18 million in scholarships and grants.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

- EHTHS fields 28 varsity teams that compete in the Cape Atlantic League and Group IV/V for NJSIAA sports. Our Football and Wrestling Teams compete in the recently created Group V division, reserved for the largest high schools in the state. Our athletic teams have won numerous state and sectional championships. The most recent state championship team is our Girls Track & Field, who captured the Group IV State Championship title in 2021. Past state and sectional championship teams include Football, Girls Basketball, Boys Basketball, Girls Swimming, Track & Field, Boys and Girls Crew and Golf.
- There are over 30 clubs and organizations at EHTHS. One of our most active organizations is our Wingman Student Ambassador Mentor program. Students take part in a rigorous selection process and are chosen based on character, leadership and commitment to their school community.
- Students participate in numerous services learning projects through local and national clubs including Key Club, Interact Club, Renaissance, FBLA, FCCLA, among others.
- EHTHS has also been designated as a NJ Model School of the Arts. This recognition is the result of a rigorous and comprehensive curriculum that includes music, art, theater and dance.
